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LIFE'S COVER

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The subscription name plate shown above is just like that of Life's other subscribers. This one belongs to one of the most remote of them all, the Dalai Lama, the god-king of Tibet, who appears on this week's cover wearing a gold peaked cap as he receives a gold casket containing a relic of the original Buddha. This relic was brought to him for

veneration at Yatung near the Indian border, where he found sanctuary after his flight from Lhasa. How that historic flight began and ended is told on pages 130—142. Up to now, Life's circulation department has had no request from the Dalai Lama to change his subscription address from Lhasa to Yatung.

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



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
